

Applying For A Learner License In Texas

All documents must be original or certified copies. No photocopies are accepted.

- ☆ Verification of Enrollment Form- This is issued by the school that the student attends. (Public, charter, home, or private, or GED programs)
-OR- Present a high school diploma.
- ☆ DE-964 Certificate- This is issued by the driving school once the student has successfully passed the permit written exam. (There is a \$5 fee for us to issue a duplicate if the original is lost or damaged.)
- ☆ Two documents that contain parent/guardian name and Texas residence dated within the last 30 days. Named parent must be present with the student. (Texas Residency Affidavit form lists acceptable documents)
- ☆ One document verifying your citizenship. Most commonly this is an original or certified copy of the student's birth certificate.
- ☆ Student's social security card.
- ☆ Learner permit fee (\$16)

Contact the DPS office if you need a list of acceptable documents for proof of residence & citizenship.

Once you have all required paperwork, a parent or legal guardian must accompany the student to the DPS office to complete the paperwork. The student must be at least 15 years of age before applying for a permit.
